



## **Terri Tchorzynski Named 2017 School Counselor of the Year**



**ALEXANDRIA, VA** – Terri Tchorzynski, a school counselor at Calhoun Area Career Center (CACC) in Battle Creek, Mich., has been named the 2017 School Counselor of the Year. The award, presented by the American School Counselor Association, honors the professionals who devote their careers to serving as advocates for the nation’s students and addressing their academic and social/emotional development and college and career readiness.

Tchorzynski is a graduate of Central Michigan University and Spring Arbor University. She began her career as a high school English teacher and has served as a high school counselor for seven years. Tchorzynski always had a desire to help people and realized early in her career that being a school counselor was the path for her.

Her passion for service to others, to her students, her integrity and her work ethic make her an invaluable member of our student services team.”

The honorees will be honored in a White House ceremony and be formally recognized at a black-tie gala.
