### The ASCA National Model Ensures Real, Measurable Results

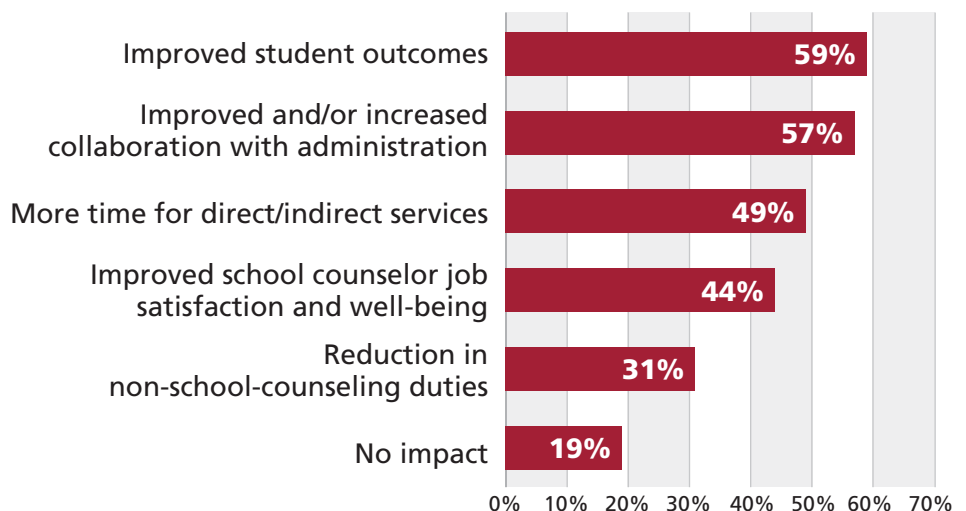
When a school's school counseling program is aligned with the ASCA National Model, intention is transformed into action – improving student achievement and ensuring access to support for each and every student.

### School Counseling Program Assessment

RAMP schools consistently outperform national averages in every program quality measure.

## ASCA National Model Programs Improve School Counselor Job Satisfaction & Retention



**76%**

of RAMP school counselors are satisfied with their job, compared with 66% of all school counselors.



**82%**

of respondents who are satisfied with their job role have a school counseling program based on the ASCA National Model, compared with 74% of the full sample.



**77%**

of RAMP school counselors expect to remain in the field for five years, compared with just 60% overall.



## RAMP Protects the School Counselor Role
